


# LIVING IN BUENOS AIRES, STUDYING AT AUSTRAL


Most international students studying at Universidad Austral prefer to live in the city of Buenos Aires. We recommend the “barrios”- neighbourhoods- from where you can commute more easily to our campus. Universidad Austral’s main campus is in Pilar, a suburban area 1 hour North of Buenos Aires. <https://goo.gl/maps/PK9diAy7wqD2>.



If you plan to take the Austral shuttle, any point in the city near the first six stops will allow you to commute comfortably. The cost of the Austral shuttle is an average USD 7 roundtrip. You will be able to make reservations in the Austral Shuttle once you receive your @austral user email.

If you plan to take the 57 public bus, the recommended area is the one near Plaza Italia, where you have the most direct route out of the city. The cost of the trip is 1USD round trip. You will have a 15minute walk to the campus from the bus stop in Pilar. Below you will find a couple of maps marking the stops and the routes of both options.

## Charter and 57 bus stops in the city



## 57 bus stop in Pilar





## Some options to find a place to live<sup>1</sup>

### What to take into account when looking for a place to live

1. **LOCATION:** Make sure it is a safe area and that it will work well for your logistics (ask us if you have any doubts).
2. **CONTRACT:** Request a copy of the contract prior to your arrival, ask any doubts you have, and indicate if something important has been omitted or if there is some clause that is not reasonable. Pay special attention to:
  - a The owner's rights and responsibilities, and your own as well.
  - b The duration and termination clauses of the contract.
  - c The deposit policies are (when and how they should be returned).
  - d The currency and payment method
  - e What is included in the price and what is not.
  - f What you are allowed or not to do in the apartment/room (e.g. hosting a friend or family member overnight) or building (gatherings, parties, etc.).
  - g The services and utilities the place has (water, electricity, gas, cable TV, internet, etc.).
3. **POLICIES:** If you choose to live in a hall of residence or to do *homestay* ask about the rules and policies. At *homestays* in particular, ask about the use of common areas (including the kitchen, laundry, etc.), if you can have your meals saved for later, etc.
4. **MAINTENANCE:** Ask how to go about in case there a problem with utilities (e.g. if internet is down): who to call, how to reach that person, etc. Ideally, there should be someone you could reach 24/7.
5. **INITIAL CONDITIONS:** Upon arrival double-check that everything is as stipulated and inform any preexisting damage, difference or missing item as soon as you notice it.
